Clarification—Sheepskin on pony nosebands

I've been asked if clarification on the below ruling in relation to sheepskin being used on nosebands can be circulated to the stewards. Having confirmed this with the NSC there was no intention for the below wording to prohibit the use of sheepskin nosebands on ponies, these are allowed providing what is underneath the sheepskin noseband adheres to the below rule i.e a plain leather cavesson noseband with a sheepskin noseband on a pony is allowed.

102.8 The following additional restrictions apply to pony competitors only:

- (a) Correctly fitted standing and running martingales only to be used (can be used together). Any type of running reins, Market Harborough reins, hackamores (see * below), bitless bridles and combination bits are not
- permitted in the arena, practice area or anywhere in the immediate vicinity of the showground. *Hackamores to be permitted for 148cm Pony Gold League classes only. No other bit is permitted to be used with the hackamore.
- (b) Pelham's/bits with curbs with a shank exceeding 6cm, measured at maximum extension from the bottom of the mouth piece to the bottom of the bit shank, may not be ridden with one rein when using the ring below
- the mouth piece and must be ridden with rounding's, split reins or two reins. Pelham's/bits with curbs with a shank not exceeding a maximum of 6cm may be ridden with one rein. The total length of the Pelham/bits with curbs may not exceed 15cm.
- (c) Nosebands must be constructed of leather and should be fitted flat against the head of the pony. Only one noseband may be worn. Rope, elastic or chained nosebands are not permitted.
- (d) Standing martingales must be attached to a flat leather surface cavesson noseband that is at least 2cm wide

National Sport Notes

Please find below a number of points from the latest National Sport Meeting:

- Children in the warm up arena—children are only permitted in the warm up arena from the year in which they reach 12 years old
- * Effective from the 1st July 2019, practice wings must be taped or marked at 1m (orange), 1.20m (yellow) and 1.30m (green). The responsibility for the taping or marking of practice wings will be down to the Show Organiser/Secretary and the Course Designer.

Safeguarding

As part of our ongoing commitment to the development of our British Showjumping Officials and the changing nature of our sport, we have introduced a new requirement for all Officials to be trained and certified in the safeguarding of children and vulnerable persons. There will be no financial cost to Officials as this will be covered by British Showjumping as part of this continued commitment. This training program has and will continue to be rolled out over the coming months as detailed below. The Equestrian Basic Safeguarding Awareness course will form part of all Officials retention criteria and will need to be refreshed every 3 years.

Level 1 Steward - Collecting Ring

We have relaunched the Collecting Ring Steward Status as a Level 1 Steward. The new role will be wider reaching and carry more responsibilities and powers than the old qualification, as such all candidates will need to attend the Official training sessions delivered by British Showjumping to achieve the status of Level 1 Steward.

Further to this the Collecting Ring Steward accreditation will be phased out over the coming months, therefore those who are currently listed as collecting ring Stewards that would like to remain listed as Level 1 Stewards will need to attend an upcoming training session.

Official Pathways Update

The new pathways have been posted on the website. The main changes are as follows:

Judges:

Level 3 Upgrade	Changes made to the frequency of return by those candidates that are not successful
Judges App	Changes made to the criteria for Advanced app users. Changed to 90 "live" classes. All current Advanced users will be checked against the new criteria.

Course Designers:

Level 1 & 2	All future assessment at this level will be conducted at the NTC
Level 3 & 4	New levels to be introduced "Candidate 3" & "Candidate 4" so to open up the opportunity for assessment at correct levels. As follows:
	Candidate 3 - For the duration of the period from acceptance of application to assessment date, Level 2 CD (Candidate 3) will be eligible to build 1.30 open with a maximum 1st prize of £100.
	Candidate 4 - For the duration of the period from acceptance of application to assessment date, Level 3 CD (Candidate 4) will be eligible to build 1.40 opens with a maximum 1st prize of £200.
Level 5 Upgrade	Changes made to the frequency of return by those candidates that are not successful.

Ticket to ride - Online purchase

The new Ticket to ride procedure will shortly be announced on the British Showjumping Website. From the 1st October, a ticket to ride for the combination for the day can be purchased online and will run in tandem with the paper tickets (one ticket purchased per class) already in circulation.

As of 1st January paper tickets will no longer be accepted.
