


#### **Course Designers Progression Chart**





#### Level 1 to Level 2





#### Level 2 to Level 3





## **UPGRADE NOTES**

- Level 1 to 2 & Level 2 to 3 must complete 12 show days to upgrade
- Level 3 to 4 must complete 18 days to upgrade
- Level 4 to 5 must complete 24 show days to upgrade
- All levels encouraged to work with more senior Course Designers
- Must attend an Officials Training Event every 2 years
- Exams are both Written and Oral Exams
  - Written = Open Book
  - Oral = Closed Book

## **RETENTION NOTES**

- Must attend an Officials Training Event every 2 years
- Levels 1 / 2 / 3 must complete a minimum of 6 show days a year to be retained at current level, if not, may be downgraded
- Levels 4 / 5 must complete a minimum of 10 show days a year to be retained at current level, if not, may be downgraded
